



In tender remembrance of Henry Charles Dawson, Lieut in the Inniskilling Dragoons, eldest surviving Son of Henry and Louisa Finch Dawson. He died of fever at Balaclava in the Crimea, Oct: 5th 1854, aged 19, while on Service with the Army, and was buried at the head of the Harbour, where his Brother Officers have raised a monument to his memory. In this the place of his Mother records her sorrow, comforted by the remembrance of what his short life had been and by the belief that in his death far from home and hindered underneath him were the Everlasting Arms.

"Thy will be done."

Also in memory of Louisa wife of Alfred Phillips Ryder, Captain R. M. and eldest daughter of Henry and Louisa Finch Dawson. She died at Sliema in the Island of Malta, Oct: 10th 1855, aged 22, and was buried in Floriani Cemetery, leaving to a husband and an infant Son an example of the tenderest and purest love, the deepest devotion, and the most self-denying charity.
